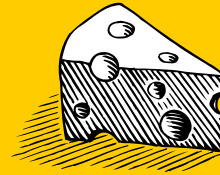
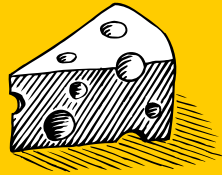

### February Chapter Event: Mad Rollin' Dolls

On **Saturday, February 23<sup>rd</sup>** the Swiss Valley H.O.G. Chapter will head to Madison for some good food and Roller Derby. That's right, I said roller derby. You used to watch it on television, now come see it live! The Mad Rollin' Dolls are a Madison based roller derby team that will start its fourth season this year. Their second bout of the season is Saturday, February 23<sup>rd</sup> at 7:00 p.m. You can visit their website at [www.madrollindolls.com](http://www.madrollindolls.com)

Prior to the bout we will go to dinner at Quivey's Grove. We will need to be at Quivey's at 5:00 p.m. in order to make it to the bout on time. We will meet at Kutter and leave at 4:00 p.m. sharp. You are allowed to bring a chair to sit as it is pretty much standing room at the bout.

Sign up is at Kutter in the H.O.G. Corner. **We will need pre-payment for the roller derby so tickets can be purchased in advance. The deadline to sign up and pay for this event is Tuesday, February 12<sup>th</sup>.** Please pay at the counter and write "paid" next to your name on the sign up sheet. The cost is \$10 per person.

**Wanna talk the talk? Here's your roller derby cheat sheet.**

**Bout** - The game, as in, THE GAME. Some sports have a match, derby has a bout. Mad Rollin' Dolls home games feature two bouts; all four home teams play each other each month.

**Periods** - A bout consists of two twenty-minute periods. Two teams play each bout, with one match-up playing the first and third periods and the other playing the second and fourth.

**Jams** - Each episode of play. Jams run for up to two minutes, but can be called off sooner by the Lead Jammer.

**Positions** - As in any sport, derby skaters have specialized positions:

- **Jammer** - She is the team's scorer; each team has one jammer on the track at a time, identified by the star on her helmet. The jammer is typically fast, elusive, and hard to knock down.
- **Blocker** - Like an offensive lineman - except smaller, cuter, and much better smelling - a blocker's job is to open holes in the pack for their jammer to skate through, while obstructing the path and closing holes in the pack for the opposing jammer.
- **Pivot** - The pivot controls the pack and her players. She skates at the front of the pack, setting the pace and positioning herself to help her jammer break through that last block, while trying to make sure the opposing jammer isn't able to get by.

**Play** - Pivots battle at the front of the pack, while blockers mix it up just behind them. The first jammer to fight their way through the pack legally becomes the Lead Jammer, giving her the option of "calling the jam" (ending it) when it helps her team. The jammers work to lap the pack as many times as possible, scoring points for each member of the opposing team she passes *legally*. They score an additional point for lapping the opposing jammer.

**Penalizing** - Flat-track roller derby has a vast array of personal fouls, resulting in penalties that include being subject to time in the penalty cage or humiliating activities dictated by our very own Zsa Zsa LaGore, Doll of Discipline.

## Road Captain Report

Hi everyone. The good news is every day is one day closer to spring - The bad news is it won't quit snowing! I thought this might be a good month to talk about group riding tips, so when the weather finally breaks and we can finally ride again, we'll all be on the same page and ready to go.

These are tips that I took out of the Primary Officer Training Manual:

- 1) Know your limits and ride within them. Never ride above your abilities.
- 2) Come to the ride prepared:
  - A. Arrive with a full tank and an empty bladder
  - B. Bring appropriate riding gear
- 3) Maintain a constant speed. This helps prevent the rubber band effect.
- 4) Always ride in a tight staggered or single file formation keeping two seconds between you and the bike in front of you .
- 5) Your eyes should be watching a few bikes up the road from you, NOT fixed on the bike in front of you - always be looking 4 seconds ahead.
- 6) Never come up on the motorcycle in front of you.
- 7) Stick together as a group. If someone has bike trouble the sweep will stop and help them and the group will continue on to the next stop.

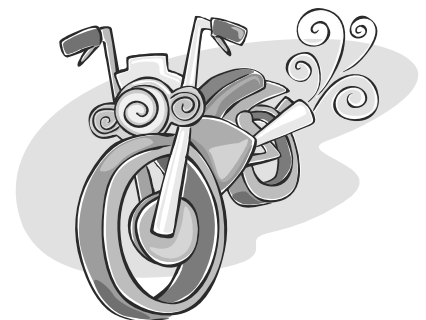
This year we will be staging our rides on the east side of Kutter's parking lot so we can be lined up and ready to go. We will have our pre-ride meeting at the front of the line by the lead bike. We will try and do this 10 minutes before our leaving time.

Well, that's enough for this month. Hopefully by the time I write next month's article we will be able to see the light at the end of the tunnel and well be back on the road again soon.

Just a reminder that we are trying to get the dinner ride calendar filled in ASAP. The sign up sheet is at Kutter. Dinner rides will be the third Wednesday of each month beginning in May.

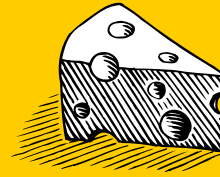
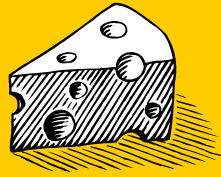

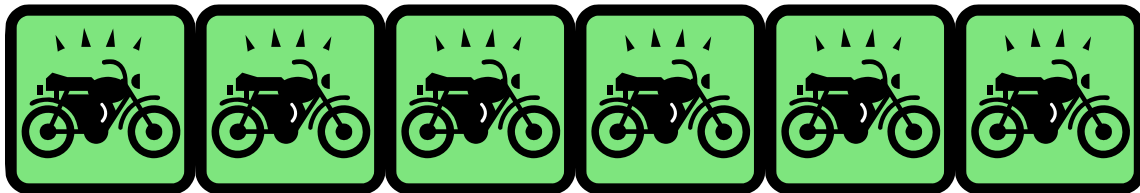
